My administration is proud to have worked with Black communities and leaders throughout Illinois to recognize Juneteenth as an official holiday celebrating the end of slavery in the United States.

It took more than two years after the signing of the Emancipation Proclamation to formally free the last of the Confederacy's enslaved people when Union Major General Gordon Granger announced the enforcement of the Proclamation in Galveston, Texas, on June 19, 1865. This is the day we celebrate the freedom of our Black siblings and the social, economic, and cultural contributions they have made to these United States of America and Illinois. Juneteenth takes on an even greater significance as the United States contends with its long history of anti-Black policing and Jim Crow laws, which are the foundation for 21st century injustices.
